Keeping Pets

Pets can bring pleasure and companionship and are an important part of their owner's lives. We ask that pet owners act responsibly and with consideration for their neighbours by following these simple rules.

Tenants are welcome to keep domestic pets such as cats, dogs, fish, rabbits and small caged birds providing they do not cause nuisance or annoyance to their neighbours.

Domestic pets are allowed in most homes, as long as they are well behaved and don't cause a nuisance. However, you may not keep a dog or any other large animal if your home is served by a shared entrance, such as a block of flats or Sheltered Housing Scheme, without our written permission.

There may be exceptions to this rule such as guide dogs for the blind and hearing dogs.

Please contact us for more information.

If you wish to build any structure to keep your pets, such as a kennel, aviary or pigeon loft you must obtain our written permission.

You must keep any pets, birds or animals in clean conditions and the areas around any hutches, pens or cages must be kept clean and tidy and free from rubbish.

You must make sure any droppings or faeces from pets are cleared away regularly and disposed of properly.

These are all conditions of your Tenancy Agreement.



When we visit you

Please keep your pets under control when North Lincolnshire Homes staff or our partners call at your home to visit you or carry out work.

Nuisance

If your dog or any other pet causes annoyance to your neighbours by continual noise it is a breach of tenancy conditions and we will take action.

Dangerous dogs

It is an offence to own or have charge of a dog that is dangerously out of control and acts in an aggressive manner. This could lead to prosecution in court and is also a breach of tenancy conditions.

Dogs around neighbourhoods

Any dog visiting a communal area must be kept on a lead at all times.

Do not let your dog roam free. You must pay any costs incurred if the dog warden picks up your stray dog.

It is an offence - under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 and The Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act 2005 - to allow your dog to foul in any public area and not clean up and dispose of the waste afterwards. It is not only unsightly but is also a danger to public health. You could be fined for allowing this to happen and it is a breach of tenancy conditions.

Residents experiencing any nuisance or annoyance from pets or animals should report it to their Housing Officer.
